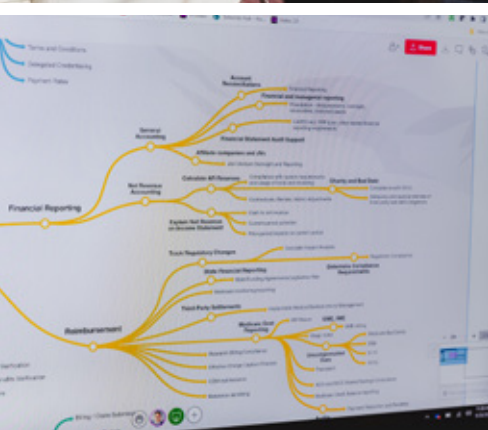

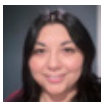
Ben Hayhurst

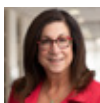
Susan Searcy
