

Workday: Enrolling your mobile device with Microsoft Authenticator app

Overview

Crowe has implemented Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) on your Workday account, which will safeguard access to data and applications by requiring a two-step verification to access any resources from a non-Crowe computer, including your mobile device.



You are being asked to register for Multi-Factor Authentication. So, what does that mean? It means that Crowe is taking extra steps to make sure you are who you say you are when you sign into Workday on your personal computer. This extra verification, also known as two-step verification, is done through a combination of your Workday username and password, and a mobile device or phone.

Two-step verification is more secure than just a password because it relies on two forms of authentication: something you know, and something you have with you. The something you know is your Workday password. The something you have with you is a phone or device that you commonly have with you. Two-step verification helps to stop malicious hackers from pretending to be you, because even if they have your password, they will not have your device, too.

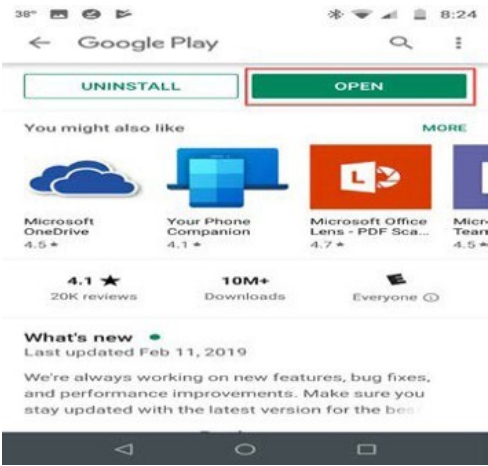
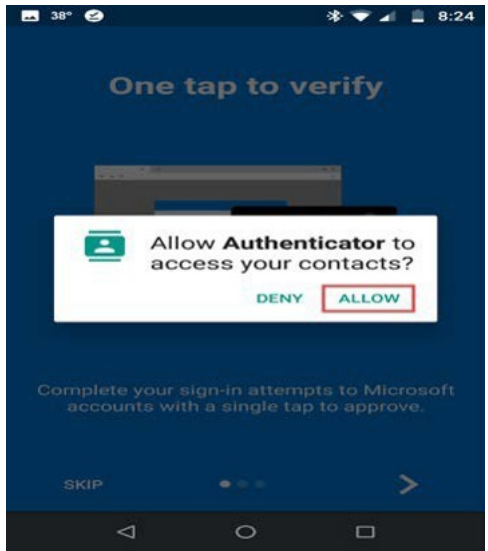
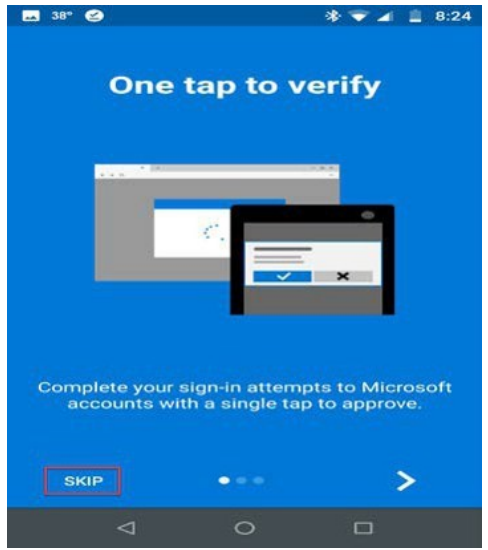
After you register, you will have a two-step verification process with strong authentication with a range of easy verification options such as mobile app notification, text message or phone call to access your online data or applications.

Installing the Microsoft Authenticator app

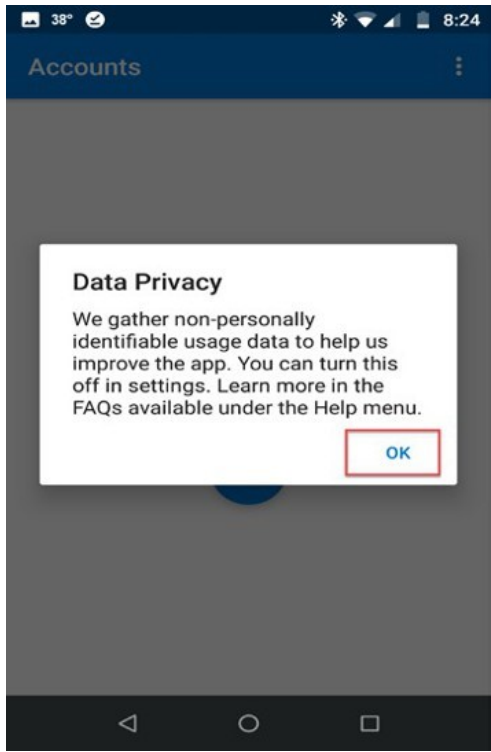
Please take your time with the step-by-step guidance below. Note: If you already have the Microsoft Authenticator app installed on your mobile device, you can skip to the **Setting up Your Account** section.

#	Step	Screenshot
1	On your mobile device, open the App Store (iOS) or Play Store (Android) application and search for Microsoft Authenticator .	
2	Tap Install .	

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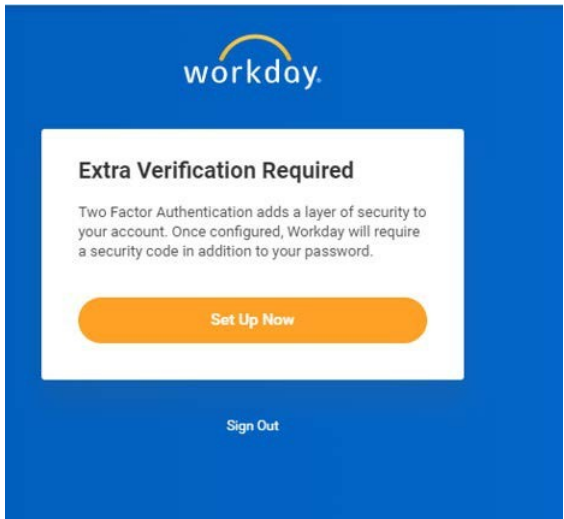

3	<p>Open the Microsoft Authenticator app on your mobile device.</p>	
4	<p>If prompted to “Allow Authenticator to access your contacts,” tap Allow.</p>	
5	<p>Step through the welcome screens; or tap Skip.</p>	

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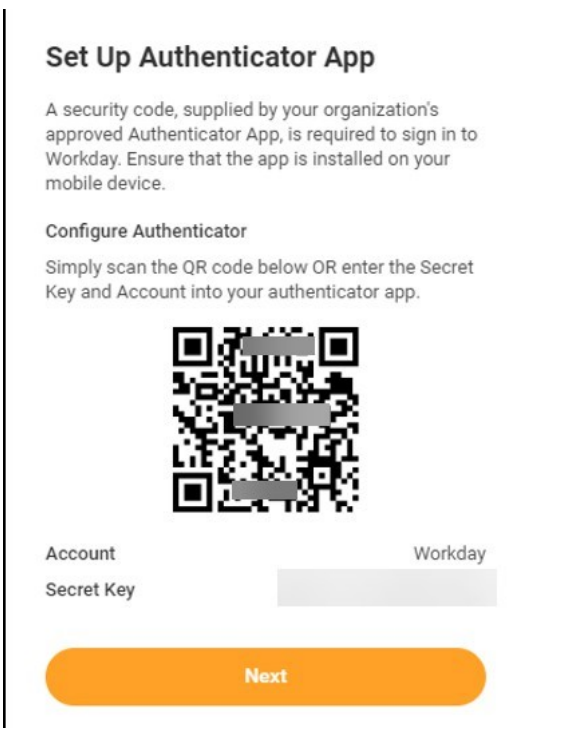

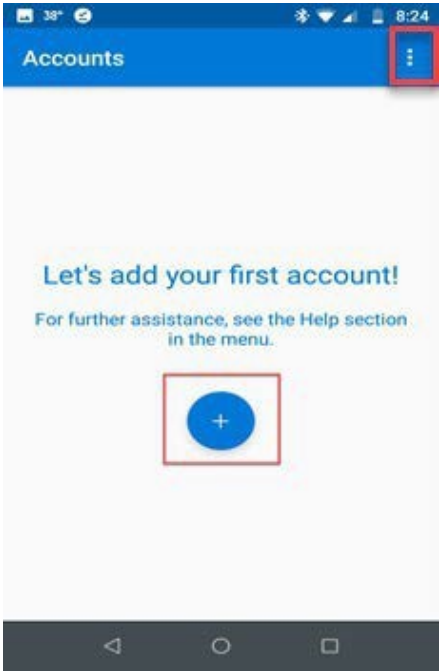

6	If you receive the “Data Privacy” prompt, tap OK .	

Setting up Your Account

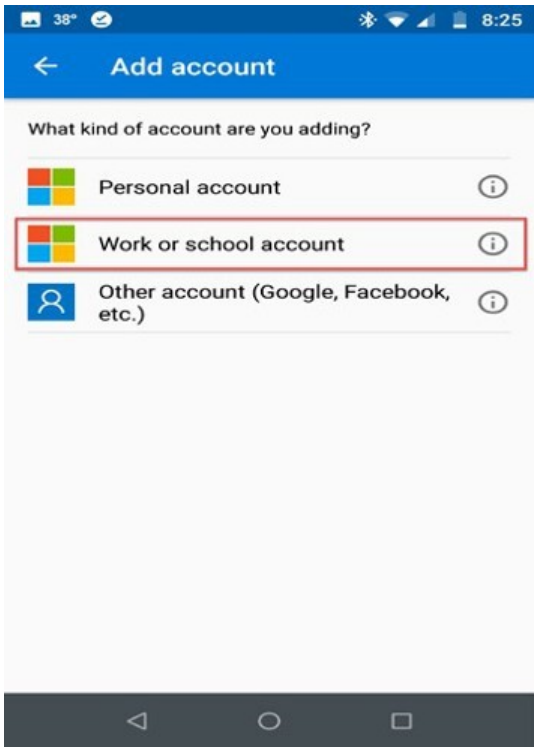
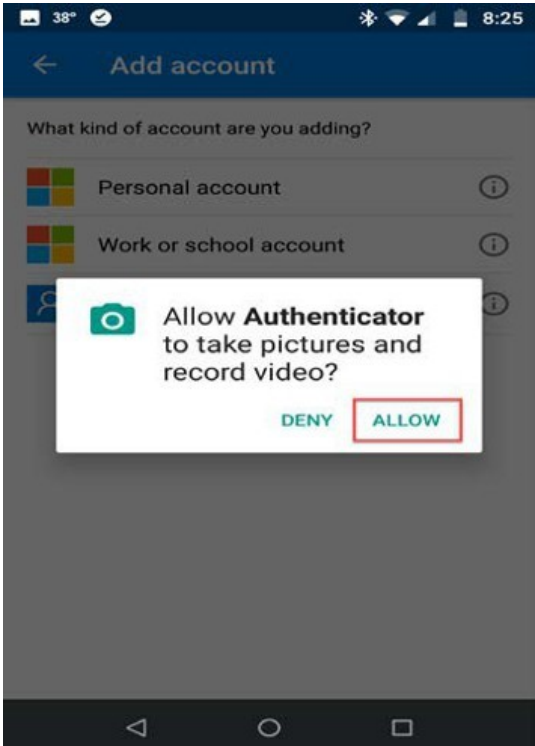
Once you log in to Workday with your username and password using your personal computer, and after the password change screen, you will receive a prompt to set up MFA.

1	On the “Extra Verification Required” screen, select Set Up Now .	

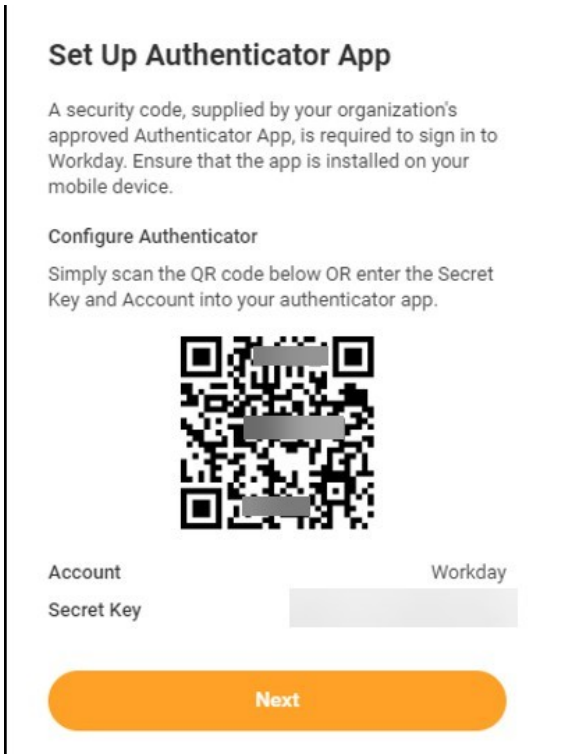

2	<p>On the “Set Up Authenticator App” screen, a QR code will appear. Keep the QR code screen open.</p>	
3	<p>On your mobile device, open the Microsoft Authenticator app if it isn't already open.</p>	
4	<p>To add your account, select the plus sign (+) (on iOS devices). (On Android devices, select the three dots, then Add account.)</p>

7	<p>With your mobile device, scan the QR code on the screen you opened earlier on your personal computer.</p> <p>Once the QR code is scanned successfully, you will see that a Crowe Workday account has been created with a unique, 6-digit number in the Microsoft Authenticator app. This 6-digit number is only valid for 30 seconds. After 30 seconds, it will generate a new, unique, 6-digit number (this is needed for the next step).</p>	
8	<p>Input the 6-digit Workday account code from the MS Authenticator app* in the "Security Code" field on the "Confirm Security Code" Workday screen on your computer. Then select Next.</p> <p>*Note that you may need to tap or double click on Workday account in the MS Authenticator app to show the one-time security code.</p>
