#### Introducing the HITRUST AI Security Assessment and certification

Building on the recent launch of the Al Risk Management Assessment, HITRUST now offers the Al Security Assessment and accompanying certification – an innovative solution addressing the unique security challenges of Al systems, tailored specifically for organizations deploying Al technologies.

As part of the HITRUST CSF® v11.4 framework, this certification includes 44 prescriptive controls designed to safeguard various AI deployment scenarios, ensuring resilience against emerging threats.

By integrating leading standards such as those from National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), International Organization for Standardization (ISO), and Open Worldwide Application Security Project (OWASP), the AI Security Assessment delivers a practical, streamlined approach to compliance. Additionally, organizations can use shared responsibility and inheritance features to simplify their compliance journey, enhancing efficiency while building stakeholder trust in AI adoption.

#### Is the HITRUST AI certification right for you?



In the past, HITRUST offered just one assessment. Today, with multiple assessment types – including the new combined assessments – understanding the compliance factors and deliverables tied to each can become overwhelming.

#### Enhancing assurance: Integrating HITRUST e1 with SOC 2

Many organizations are seeking more robust frameworks to strengthen cybersecurity and build customer trust. Combining HITRUST e1 with SOC 2 offers a compelling path forward with approximately **80% to 90% of HITRUST e1 controls overlapping with SOC 2**. This alignment allows organizations to repurpose existing SOC 2 efforts to gain HITRUST certification, thereby minimizing redundancy, simplifying the certification process, and reducing resource strain.

Key features of SOC 2 and HITRUST e1:

- SOC 2 attestation:
  - o Focuses on the Trust Services criteria (for example, security, availability, and confidentiality)
  - o Provides an attestation report detailing an organization's adherence to chosen criteria
  - o Allows flexibility in control selection, making it adaptable to various industries
- HITRUST e1 certification:
  - Provides a one-year validated certification based on a prescriptive framework with 44 essential security controls
  - o Is tailored for smaller organizations or those with lower risk profiles, offering a streamlined yet comprehensive approach
  - Complements the SOC 2 control set well, allowing organizations to achieve certification with ease

- Increased stakeholder confidence: The HITRUST e1 certification provides a standardized approach that is recognized across industries, signaling a robust commitment to data security.
- **Scalability:** The e1 assessment is ideal for organizations starting their HITRUST journey, with the flexibility to scale to i1 or r2 certifications as they grow or face more stringent regulatory requirements.
