The Canada Revenue Agency (“CRA”) Course

Every golfer may be subject to Canadian taxation and should consider these obligations prior to their arrival in Canada. Golfers’ prize money earned at the RBC Canadian Open is subject to Canadian federal withholding tax at 15 per cent. This is not a final Canadian tax liability.
