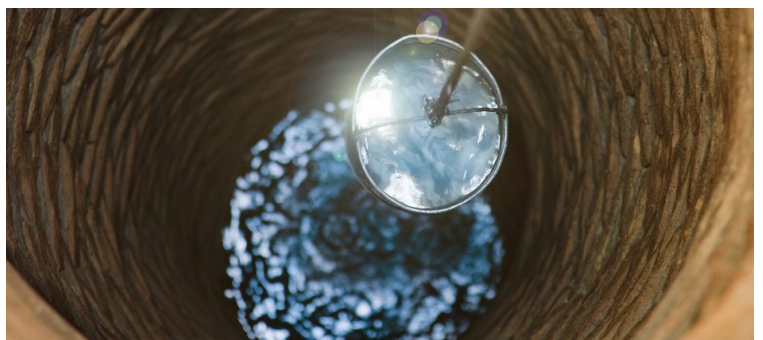

VAT compensation scheme for charities

Our [Not-for-Profit](#) team outline the detail behind the much-welcomed Value Added Tax (VAT) compensation scheme for charities. The scheme, which aims to reduce the VAT burden on charities and to partially compensate for VAT paid by the charity, applies to VAT paid on expenditure on or after 1 January 2018. Charities are entitled to claim a refund of a proportion of their VAT costs based on the level of non-public funding they receive.

Film financing – updates to Section 481 film relief from Finance Bill 2018

Under Section 481, a company which produces a film can claim a payable tax credit of 32% of eligible expenditure, subject to certain limits. Our [Film, Media & Creative Industries team](#) outline a number of anticipated changes to the Section 481 scheme set out in Finance Bill 2018.

The scheme, which is to be extended from end-2020 to end-2024, is a valuable support to aid film financing in Ireland.
